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TIP OF THE WEEK - God hasn't made this concept of parenting with grace that difficult. There are four basic things you need to do to maintain a grace based environment for your children. If you get these four things up and running, then parenting challenges seem to find natural and reasonable solutions. These four items will become a filter system that enables you to process the day-to-day dilemmas that come with raising kids. They will help you discern how to deliver grace in any given moment. When these four things combine with the inner needs of a secure love, a significant purpose, and a strong hope, kids experience God's grace in a balanced way. This fourfold delivery system makes it a lot easier to show your children how to find love, purpose, and hope in Jesus Christ. The four basic things families need to do to maintain grace based environments are to give children: 1. The freedom to be different. 2. The freedom to be vulnerable. 3. The freedom to be candid. 4. The freedom to make mistakes. -- Grace Based Parenting, p. 134
